Where do our wellies take us?

We will continue to use the platform Seesaw. Pupils can use it to post their Creative Home Tasks in the form of photos, videos or PowerPoint style information pages. Some work, such as Geography and Science, may also be completed on Seesaw in class.

English Texts:

Winters Child by Angela McAllister and *The Santa Trap* by Jonathon Emmett.

Class Text: *Ice Palace* by Robert Swindells.

The children will also be having SPAG sessions to revisit and build on skills introduced in Year 2.

In Maths, we will be focussing on column methods for addition and subtraction, with and without exchanging. We will then be moving onto multiplication and division. During this unit, we will also be consolidating our 2, 5 and 10-times tables alongside learning/practising our 3, 4 and 8-times tables. We will also use what we have learned to answer problem solving and reasoning questions.

In ICT, we will be learning about Desktop Publishing and how to change font size, colour and style, and layout in order to create their own digital poster.

In Science, we will be completing experiments linked to all of our Science units this term. These include the human body, forces, plants and light. The children will be expected to learn and use scientific vocabulary specific to these topics, and they will also be using their prediction and observation skills. These experiments will also teach the children how to complete fair tests in Science, and what different variables are.

RE this term is about a different faith to Christianity; Sikhism. Our big question for the unit is 'What is important to Sikhs?' We will study what Sikhs believe, and compare and contrast this to what Christians believe.

Mrs Nash will continue to cover Cedar Class and Mrs Hobby will continue to cover Hawthorn Class for PPA on a Tuesday afternoon.

Reading:

The children will be listened to in school, by the Class Teacher and Teaching Assistant. They will also be choosing a book (within their 'Accelerated Reader' level) to read in school and bring home to continue reading and share with you. Children can also choose a 'reading for pleasure' book.

In Geography, we will continue to focus on map skills using atlases and will be locating different continents and countries, as well as human and physical features of these places.

Both classes need PE kit on a Tuesday for cricket. Thursdays and Fridays are Hawthorn PE days and Wednesday for Cedar. Please wear your PE kits to school on these days. Cedar have Forest School on Thursday afternoons.
